In each of the departments, for each subject (theory and practical) being taughtat undergraduate and post graduate level a senior faculty memberisnominated as convenor who then co-ordinates curriculum transaction with other faculty membersteaching the subject during the semester. Before the session begins, teaching plans are prepared and discussed along with the mode of Continuous Internal Evaluation.
